"heard a <i>pop</i> " "felt a <i>pop</i> "	"Pop's" are followed by pain and can be described as pain.
Pull	Pain
"felt a <i>pull</i> "	
Hurt	Describe the injury; pain, laceration,

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"Employee <i>hurt</i> themselves while lifting heavy equipment".	abrasion, puncture, etc. and the body part/s affected.
Weak	Fatigued
Light-headed	Dizzy
Threw up / Puked	Vomited
Sick/ Ill / Unwell /	Write out the actual complaints. Example: nauseous, dizzy, etc.)
